Subject line: Decriminalise sex work for safety's sake

Dear
I'm writing to you as a member/supporter of the English Collective of Prostitutes. I live and work in [place] and I'm aware of your organisation's work to support
An urgent priority for me is the decriminalisation of sex work and safety for sex workers.

As you may be aware, sex work is on the increase in the UK as a result of austerity and rising poverty. At the same time, sex workers are prevented by the law from working safely and record numbers are facing raids, arrests, prosecution and even prison.
